

Traveled all over Europe- Prague, Budapest, Vienna, Stockholm, Brussels, Amsterdam, Copenhagen, Helsinki, St. Petersburg, Madrid, Barcelona, San Sebastian, as well as London and Ireland. Also traveled to China (Beijing, Chongking, Xian, Wuhei, Yangtze River and Shanghai). We have been to Israel twice, and visited Egypt (Cairo and the Nile), Amman and Petra, Jordan, and Istanbul, Coppadacia, Ephesus and Greece. Also traveled to Australia and New Zealand. Recently returned from Northern India (Mumbai, Jodhpur, Jaipur, Udaipur, Veranassi, Agra and Delhi). Active with various banking trade groups in Washington, DC (Financial Services Roundtable and American Bankers Association) and have co-chaired various Task Forces.

Please share some of your favorite TU memories: Had a number of

excellent teachers at TU in the Political Science, Economics and History areas: Doctors Adair, Patrick Conklin (who I stayed in contact with over the years and was my favorite instructor), Cadenhead (my adviser) and Holloway. I recall doing my first public speaking in a pro-anti debate with a TU student from the YAF group on whether the US should recognize China (this was in 1962). I was quite nervous before the debate but it worked out well-I took the position that the US should recognize the reality of mainland China. I developed a very close relationship with my Afghan roommate, Hafizullah Nawabi. We lived together for three years and are still very close, since he fled Afghanistan and came to the Washington, DC area shortly after the Russians invaded Afghanistan.

Have you been involved with TU since graduation? I established the Bleier-Nawabi Scholarship for Jewish and Muslim students.

Who or what are you most looking forward to seeing when you return to **TU?** Seeing the campus and the current John Mabee Dorms and the Quad. Have not been back since graduation.

What have you been up to for the past 50 years? After graduating from TU in 1962 I went to Georgetown University Law Center and received my JD in 1965. I then attended the Johns Hopkins School for International Studies. While in DC I met my wife (Carol Stein) at then National Airport on December 23, 1965. We were engaged four months later (she still can't understand why I was so slow) and married six months after, on October 9, 1966. I started my professional career at the Federal Trade Commission and in 1971 I joined the Legal Division of the Federal Reserve Board in

Washington, DC, eventually becoming Assistant General Counsel responsible for the bank holding company and banking structure area of the Legal Division. In March 1982 I left to join Mellon Bank "for an offer I couldn't refuse" two days after PA law was amended to allow statewide banking. I became General Counsel in 1992 and managed a Legal Department of over 100 attorneys in multiple locations in the US and overseas. During my time at Mellon I was responsible for all the regulatory work for the entire Mellon complex. For much of my time at Mellon I also was head of the Government Relations group. I was responsible for the creation and implementation of Mellon's successful Good Bank-Bad Bank structure, as well as doing all the regulatory and legislative work regarding Mellon's merger with The Dreyfus Corporation. In late 2006, after having worked under five chairmen, I decided that was enough and since my Deputy was going to be the new General Counsel, I left Mellon and joined Reed Smith's Pittsburgh office, as a Partner. In my time at Reed Smith I have counseled banks and bank holding companies as well as staying active and involved with the evolving world of financial services. While at Mellon I also was (for five years) Chair of the Lawyers Council of the Financial Services Roundtable, and was recently Co-Chair of the American Bar Association's Task Force on Financial Restructuring. I also speak at conferences and webinars on an array of banking issues as well as authoring numerous articles that have appeared in several professional publications.
